In the full spirit of Christmas, Apple Australia has done a lot of special bundling of bargains at special prices. It is taking the Apple IIe and IIc and for the normal recommended retail price is bundling in programs and peripherals exceeding \$550 in value.

With the IIc you get the AppleMouse II and Mousepaint graphics program, MasterType's Writer wordprocessing program, the magazine on a disk, Microzine, and Hitchhikers Guide to the Galaxy. Plus the Human Edge program Mind over Minors which teaches you how to cope with ankle biters and is fairly controversial.

The IIe is being bundled with the new UniDisk drive which gives you a whopping 800K of memory on each 3.5" disk. Also thrown in is AppleWorks, the three in one program, Typequick and Microzine. Plus a book of vouchers which gets you 20% off software packages.

AIIA stresses need for trading edge

The pros and cons of ID cards

IN A recent appearance before the Senate Standing Committee on Science, Technology and the Environment, the Australian Information Industry Association stressed the importance of technological change on the international competitiveness of industry.

In its submission, the AIIA said the committee's investigations should primarily address how Australia must incorporate this technology into its own industries to make them more competitive.

Competitiveness

Mr Bob Mounie, executive director of the AIIA, said this was particularly important in Australia's case because we were essentially a trading nation. Improved international competitiveness was crucial to the economic viability of our national base.

The committee's terms of reference cover the adequacy of current mechanisms to investigate and monitor the introduction and current applications of new technology and the need for a national technology assessment system.

In response to questions raised by the committee, the AIIA noted that some traditional job definition would change and new jobs would emerge in evolving industries.

It claimed that evidence of this is apparent in Australia in the software industry where there is a major shortage of skilled people.

"This area of the information technology industry promises a bright future and we should positively encourage its development," Mr Mounie said.

A number of initiatives had

already been made by the Government in this regard, including the 150 per cent tax-based research and development incentives and the review of the effects policy.

'Issue question'

"In the association's view the issue question is one of training, retraining and re-deployment of staff rather than examining the introduction of new technology in order to protect obsolete industrial processes," said Mr Mounie.

The AIIA noted that new growth areas were emerging in the value-added services sector and therefore it was important that the economic and freely accessible telecommunications environment was provided in Australia. This would ensure the free flow of these services to Australian industry.

ONE of the most important challenges facing the Australian computer industry would be to ensure that any federal ID card system was properly controlled and safe, without any potential for abuse.

Australian Computer Society (ACS) branch president, Mr Peter Sumner, says in this month's society newsletter that the proposed system could lead to an Australian tragedy if a huge dossier of partly-correct, readily-available information was to be developed.

"Tonight's branch meeting will comprise an open forum on the subject to discuss the pros and cons of the proposed introduction of a national identity card and personal record system.

Though designed to be interactive and aimed at establishing either a corporate or a personal ID card system, a general industry opinion the meeting will be launched by several lead speakers on the controversial subject.

Because computers would be used in the establishment of such a vast database, Mr Sumner emphasises that industry members should be keen to see that any such system complies with recognised standards and safeguards.

The absence of any privacy legislation in Australia could leave the national ID card

scheme open to abuse. "The ID card system is intended to stop fraud," Mr Sumner said.

"Therefore, suspicion is at the core of the ID card system. It gives powers to the approach it with that attitude, then potentially no one is safe."
