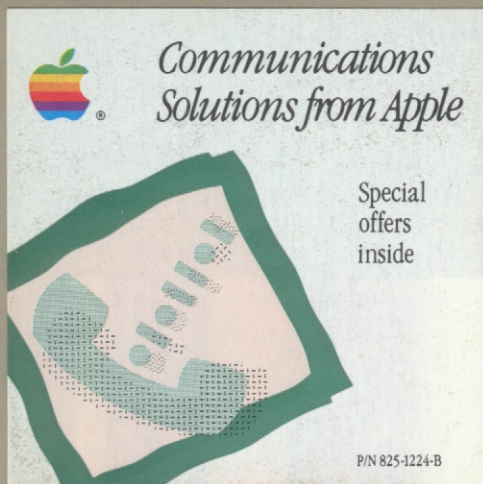


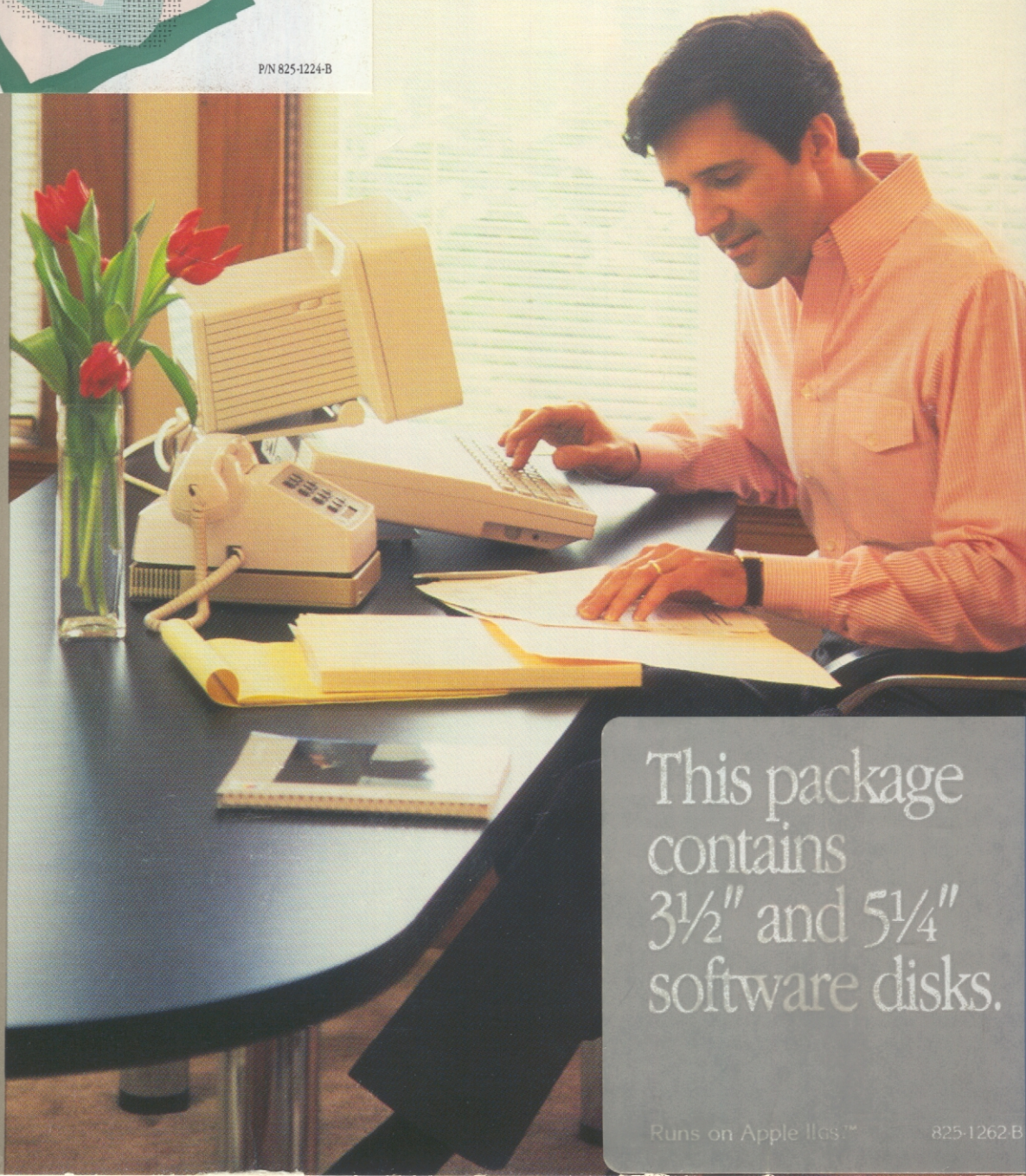

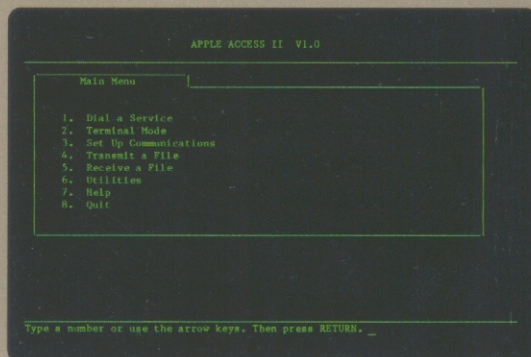


The Apple II

Access II transforms the Apple II into an intelligent terminal that can communicate with a wide range of mainframes, mini-computers, and personal computer systems. It offers Apple users far-reaching, cost-effective telecommunications—a gateway to vast stores of valuable information.

Access II makes it possible for you to:

- expand your communications capabilities by uploading and downloading ProDOS™ files to and from other Apple systems, and by exchanging data files with larger computer systems
- cut timesharing costs by downloading information to your Apple system, then working with the data off-line at your own pace
- emulate a wide variety of computer terminals, including TTY, ANSI (VT100™), and VT52™, sending and receiving data according to parameters you define
- get on line fast with just two simple keystrokes, using Access II's auto-dial and auto-log-on features.

Apple Access II Reference Manual

Access II, the best-selling communications program for the Apple® II family of computers, has been updated for compatibility with the Apple IIGS™. You can now run Access II on

- an Apple IIc
- an Apple IIe
- an Apple IIGS

Access II will not, however, run on the original Apple II or the Apple II Plus.

The *Apple Access II Reference Manual* explains how to use Access II with the Apple IIc and the Apple IIe. These instructions also apply to the Apple IIGS even though the manual doesn't refer to the Apple IIGS by name.

For information on how to use the Control Panel, see the *Apple IIGS Owner's Guide*.

If you have an Apple IIGS, you must adjust a few settings on the Apple IIGS Control Panel before you can run Access II.

Apple IIGS system speed setting

You must set the system speed setting in the Control Panel to **Fast**. This is the standard setting, so you don't need to adjust it now unless you've previously changed the system speed to normal.

Apple IIGS port settings

Access II requires that you connect printers and modems to an Apple IIGS through the ports on the computer's back panel. Access II will not work with peripheral devices connected to peripheral cards in the computer's expansion slots.

You must also make sure that the port settings on the Apple IIGS Control Panel are right for Access II, as shown in Table 1.

All of the settings except those in bold are the standard Control Panel settings.

The settings in this table will allow you to use Access II with most remote computers and information services. To confirm the settings, check the documentation for the remote computers or services you plan to use.
