Apple seems to be struggling to make some sense of its confusing product line. The Duo 210 has gone from the line-up, as has the IIvi and IIvx (which only remain in the price list due to surplus stock). In addition, although not apparent from the price list, Apple dealers are slashing prices on LC IIs, PowerBook 160s and Duo 230s in preparation for the predicted October releases of the LC 475, the LC 520, PowerBook 165 (greyscale), Duo 250 (greyscale) and Duo 270 (colour). In the US, Apple is releasing seven new Performas to either supplement or replace the existing Performa line-up - few if any of these are likely to be released in Australia.

Rumour has it that the kiss of death is about to be given to the Quadra 800 and Centris 610 — this, however, remains speculation. Also, the AudioVision 14" (pictured) is rumoured to have big brothers on the way in the form of the AudioVision 16" and 21" monitors. Apple will, we believe, rename the Centris range, calling them all Quadras to reduce confusion in its already well-stocked inventory.

Finally, it has been suggested that Apple intends to announce its first PowerPC model on January 24, the anniversary of the introduction of the first Macintosh. Availability would not be until March, nevertheless you can anticipate major changes to the entire product range and pricing structures. Stay tuned!
